Sending Church Element #1 - Cultivating Missions Awareness By Mike Easton

The first of the Sending Church Elements is "Cultivating Missions Awareness." The following are a list of practical ideas that the Upstream team has put together as recommendations for ways to cultivate missions awareness in your church.

Worship Gatherings

What are people seeing & hearing in your church's gatherings?

- <u>Sermons</u> Consider, at minimum once per year, a sermon centered on God's heart for the nations. Know your teaching schedule and encourage your teachers & preachers to focus on global missions where appropriate.
- <u>Songs</u> Sing songs in a different language or songs that your missionaries are using around the world.
- Current Events Pray for current events happening around the world—natural disasters, wars, persecution, etc.
- <u>Prayer for the Persecuted Church</u> Spend a season (a month or more) in your church focusing on prayer for the persecuted church.
- Liturgy & Benedictions Write out scripture passages or liturgies for your pastors or worship team to use during the service and as you finish the service. Do it in different languages.
- Commissioning Each time you send a missionary, have a commissioning service.
- <u>Inviting a Missionaries' Influence</u> As highly connected missionaries come back, allow them to share in a service, small groups, or equipping session.
- <u>Video Updates</u> Gather video updates from the field to play in a church service.
- Video Calls In-Service While the technology can be tricky, find ways for people to be able to call into a service, small group, or equipping session.

Building & Media

What are people seeing, hearing, & reading in your building, social media, and other forms of communication?

Building

• <u>Strategic Map/Signs</u> - Having a map in the foyer of your church building is a must for casting missions vision. Find unique ways to share your strategy and your people on the map. Creative depictions of your strategy, pictures of overseas, etc.

- <u>Prayer Cards</u> Have security conscious prayer cards available at your missions center and/or in your church offices.
- Missions Center A central place in the church foyer for people to talk to someone about global missions each week.

Media

- <u>Social Media Account</u> Run a social media account that provides reminders of global issues. Facebook Live Events
- <u>Website</u> If not a separate website, have at least one page on your church's website that describes your mission's vision.
- <u>Church Newsletter</u> Have global highlighted regularly in your church's newsletter.

Decision-Making Leadership

How are the decision-makers in your church (Elders, Deacons, Staff) coming to greater understanding and sense of responsibility towards global missions?

- <u>Book Study</u> Do a book study with key decision makers in your church.
- <u>Vision Trips</u> Take key leaders on vision trips.
- <u>Missions Team</u> Create a missions team with real responsibility in global missions that includes decision-makers in your church.

Small Groups

- Monthly Missions Focus Provide opportunities for your small groups monthly to do
- <u>Adopt a Missionary/Advocacy Teams</u> As a church delegate prayer for your missionaries to small groups. Have them all receive updates and pray at least monthly for the missionaries.
- <u>Equipping Sessions</u> Create a 4-week global missions class that gives members of your church the opportunity to learn about global missions.

Kids

- <u>Missions Focus Month</u> Do a missions focus each year for your kids ministry. Provide opportunities for them to get to know missionary kids. Provide parents reading materials.
- Videos from Missionary Kids During your missions focused month, do some videos
- Missionary Biographies Provide a good list of missionary biographies to parents. The YWAM series: "Christian Heroes" is a great place to start.

Students

• Exposure Trips - Have a regular cadence of 2-14 day exposure trips that give students the chance to see global missions opportunities that complement your global missions vision.

- Missions Study Do a book study with students through books like, <u>Finish the Mission</u> by John Piper or <u>God's Heart for the Nations</u> by Jeff Lewis.
- <u>Virtual Missions Trips</u> Have your overseas partners put together a 1-2 hour virtual missions trip exploring their city and getting to know their people.
